## God's gift of life




What was the best present you were ever given?

If it's a **book** you'll want to read it.


# Life is to be lived!

Today's passage in the Bible is about the gift of life.

God has given us new life in Jesus: and that new life is what Paul calls 'the life of God'.

That's to say, the life we've been given is really

**God living His life  
in us and through us by His Spirit**



Paul was explaining to the believers at Ephesus two things –

## 1. What that new life looks like

### Ephesians 4.25-29

<sup>25</sup>Therefore each of you must put off falsehood and speak truthfully to your neighbour, for we are all members of one body.

<sup>26</sup>'In your anger do not sin': do not let the sun go down while you are still angry, <sup>27</sup>and do not give the devil a foothold.

<sup>28</sup>Anyone who has been stealing must steal no longer, but must work, doing something useful with their own hands, that they may have something to share with those in need.

<sup>29</sup>Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen.





**“Be imitators of God .. as dearly loved children”**




and he goes on to tell us that means looking closely always at **Jesus** – what He does, and how He does it:
