

Names have meanings!

Most names have a meaning. *Your* name probably means something as well!

Elkanah's name means "purchased by God" – and that's what's true of all those who trust in Jesus!

We've been 'purchased' or 'bought' by God through what Jesus did for us when He died on the cross.

If he was living up to his name, then Elkanah would show us how we should be living as those who have been 'bought by God'.

But there's something wrong with the picture we're given here of this man Elkanah. He's not the real deal!

And looking forwards with real **hope**, because we know that Jesus has great plans for us.




Being 'religious' isn't what matters!

Read 1 Samuel 1

verses 2-7

²He had two wives; one was called Hannah and the other Peninnah. Peninnah had children, but Hannah had none.

³Year after year this man went up from his town to worship and sacrifice to the Lord Almighty at Shiloh, where Hophni and Phinehas, the two sons of Eli, were priests of the Lord.

⁴ Whenever the day came for Elkanah to sacrifice, he would give portions of the meat to his wife Peninnah and to all her sons and daughters. ⁵ But to Hannah he gave a double portion because he loved her, and the Lord had closed her womb.

⁶ Because the Lord had closed Hannah's womb, her rival kept provoking her in order to irritate her. ⁷ This went on **year after year**. Whenever Hannah went up to the house of the Lord, her rival provoked her till she wept and would not eat.

He wants us not simply to 'go to church',

but to 'come to Him'!

And that means looking to Him for His help rather than taking matters into our own hands and trying to sort things out ourselves.

don't assume that what you'd most like will be the answer to other people's problems


#3 Why are you downhearted?


