The picture comes from the story of the day of Pentecost when people ran to see and hear what was going on.

God had come by His Spirit and was doing 'a new thing' in the world!

The book of 1 Samuel tells the story of God doing a new thing in the land of Israel.

In today's passage we're going to be seeing the differences between some of the people in the story.



Read 1 Samuel 1

verse 2, 7-8

² Elkanah had two wives; one was called Hannah and the other Peninnah. Peninnah had children, but Hannah had none.

the Lord had Because closed Hannah's womb, her rival kept provoking her in order to irritate her. 7 This went on year after year. Whenever Hannah went up to the house of the Lord, her rival provoked her till she wept and would not eat. 8 Her husband Elkanah would say to her, 'Hannah, why are you weeping? Why don't you eat? Why are you downhearted? Don't I mean more to you than ten sons?'

We're going to try and spot the difference first of all between these two people – Hannah and Elkanah.

Some of the differences are obvious – like Hannah was a woman and Elkanah was a man!

But there's another important difference.

For that you need to know what Hannah's name means

Names have meanings!


(We saw that last week! Do you remember? Elkanah's name means 'God has purchased')

Hannah means 'grace'.


And grace means we look to God to do for us what we could not do ourselves.

Hannah understood that – whereas Elkanah had tried to fix his problems by himself. It doesn't work!

Read 1 Sam.1

verses 10-20

¹⁰ In her deep anguish Hannah prayed to the Lord, weeping bitterly. ¹¹ And she made a vow, saying, 'Lord Almighty, if you will only look on your servant's misery and remember me, and not forget your servant but give her a son, then I will give him to the Lord for all the days of his life, and no razor will ever be used on his head.'

¹² As she kept on praying to the Lord, Eli observed her mouth. ¹³ Hannah was praying in her heart, and her lips were moving but her voice was not heard. Eli thought she was drunk ¹⁴ and said to her, 'How long are you going to stay drunk? Put away your wine.'

¹⁵ 'Not so, my lord,' Hannah replied, 'I am a woman who is deeply troubled. I have not been drinking wine or beer; I was pouring out my soul to the Lord. ¹⁶ Do not take your servant for a wicked woman; I have been praying here out of my great anguish and grief.'

¹⁷ Eli answered, 'Go in peace, and may the God of Israel grant you what you have asked of him.' ¹⁸ She said, 'May your servant find favour in your eyes.' Then she went her way and ate something, and her face was no longer downcast.

¹⁹ Early the next morning they arose and worshipped before the Lord and then went back to their home at Ramah. Elkanah made love to his wife Hannah, and the Lord remembered her. ²⁰ So in the course of time Hannah became pregnant and gave birth to a son. She named him Samuel, saying, 'Because I asked the Lord for him.'




Hannah's prayer was answered!




The Wordsearch is about prayer: it's taken from James 5.16. See if you can find all the words!
